Destination Or Journey?

Ponder: What is life all about?

Scripture: "And these will go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life" (Matt. 25:46, NKJV).

Biblically speaking, life is most assuredly about the destination! God's purpose in creating people in the first place was to "bring many sons to glory" (Heb. 2:10). God wants a huge family to live with Him eternally! Whether you an I are among that throng depends on what direction we choose to travel on life's journey. Paul wrote that each individual will be judged by "the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad" (2 Cor. 5:10). Obviously this earthly life is when we do things in the body. Similarly, at the judgment John saw in Revelation 20, "the dead were judged according to their works" (v. 12). Again, those works were done while on life's "journey."
